

Tips for better Searching using Google



Google Search

I'm Feeling Lucky

Start simple

No matter what you're looking for, your motto should be "keep it simple." Start by entering a basic name or word. If you're looking for a place or product in a specific location, enter the name along with the town or postcode.

Try it out



Ignore spelling

Google's spell checker automatically defaults to the most common spelling of a given word, whether or not you spell it correctly.

Try it out

Search "gooogle"



Less is more

Simple, one or two word search terms will usually give you the broadest results. Start with short search terms, then refine your results by adding more words.

Try it out

Search with an exact phrase

Put quotation marks around words "[any word]" to search for an exact phrase in an exact order. Keep in mind that searching with quotes might exclude relevant results. For instance, a search for "**Alexander Bell**" will miss pages that refer to **Alexander G. Bell**.

Search "to be or not to be"

Don't worry about cases

Search isn't case sensitive. A search for **new york times** is the same as a search for **New York Times**.

Try it out

Search within a specific site

Precede your query with **site:** if you know you want your answer from within a specific site or type of site (.org, .edu). For example: **site:edu** or **site:bbc.co.uk**.

Don't worry about punctuation

Search ignores punctuation. This includes @#%^*()=[]\ and other special characters.

Try it out



Search by file type

Search for specific types of files, such as DOCs, PDFs, PPTs, or XLS, by adding **filetype:** and the 3-letter file abbreviation.

Try it out

north devon population filetype:pdf



Include or ignore words and characters in your search

Highlight common words and characters such as **the** and **&** if they are essential to your search (as in a movie or book title) by putting quotation marks "**the**" around them. You can also use the minus **-** sign to specify particular items you don't want in your results, like ingredients in a recipe.

Find related pages

Use the **related:** operator to find pages that have similar content by typing **related:** followed by the website address. For instance, if you find a website you like, try using **related:[*insert URL here*]** to locate similar websites.




Find recipes

After searching for a specific recipe or ingredients, select "Recipes" in the left panel to see recipe results.

Search "peanut butter broccoli noodles"



Search numbers in a range

Stay within your budget by searching only for items within a number range by putting a string .. between amounts.




Get number conversions

Convert any measurement -- like miles to kilometres or ounces to litres -- by typing in the number and unit of measurement.

Search "miles to km"




Get the time

To see what time it is anywhere in the world, search **time** and the city or country.

Check the weather

Search **weather** followed by a postcode or the name of any city in the world to get the current weather and forecast. Enter **weather** by itself to get the weather report for your current location.

Search "weather chicago"





1. Duolingo

This isn't the first time I've recommended this language-teaching website (and app), and it certainly won't be the last. Duolingo is a free version of Rosetta-Stone that delivers the same results: teaching you another language. Regular use of the site can have you speaking and writing Spanish, English, German, French, Portuguese and Italian in a matter of months depending on the diligence you put into it. Hopefully, even more languages will become available soon.
